

GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. DEFINITIONS

- 1.1 Biogas: Raw gas substantially composed of methane that is produced by the breakdown of organic matter in the absence of oxygen.
- 1.2 "British Thermal Unit" or "Btu" means the amount of heat required to raise the temperature of one (1) pound of water one (1) degree Fahrenheit from fifty-nine degrees Fahrenheit (59°F) to sixty degrees Fahrenheit (60°F) at a constant pressure of fourteen and seventy-three hundredths pounds per square inch absolute (14.73 psia).
- 1.3 Business Day: Monday through Friday, excluding Federal Banking holidays for transactions in the U.S., and similar holidays for transactions occurring in Canada and Mexico. [NAESB WGQ 3.2.1]
- 1.4 Central Clock Time: Central Standard Time or Central Daylight Saving Time, whichever is currently effective. All times referred to in this tariff are Central Clock Time, except where specifically noted. Pacific Clock Time, where referenced, means Pacific Standard Time or Pacific Daylight Savings Time, whichever is currently effective.
- 1.5 Critical Notice: A notice that provides information on conditions that affect scheduling or adversely affect scheduled gas flow. [NAESB WGQ 5.2.1]
- 1.6 "Cubic Foot" means the volume of gas which occupies one (1) cubic foot of space when held at a base temperature of sixty (60) degrees Fahrenheit and a base pressure of fourteen and seventy-three-hundredths (14.73) psia.
- 1.7 "Daily Reserved Capacity" is defined as the largest daily quantity of capacity that Transporter is obligated to make available to a Shipper for firm transportation under Rate Schedule FT-1 during the Winter Period.
- 1.8 "Day" or "Gas Day" is the time period from 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m. Central Clock Time (7:00 a.m. to 7:00 a.m. Pacific Clock Time). [NAESB WGQ 1.3.1]
- 1.9 "Dekatherm" or "Dth" is defined as equivalent to one million (1,000,000) Btus or one (1) MMBTU. One (1) Dth of gas shall mean the quantity of gas which contains one (1) Dth of energy.
